#### LETTER FROM THE RECTOR

## Wonder

A while ago I saw a wonderful movie entitled "Wonder." It's the story of a 10-year-old boy named Auggie Pullman. Auggie was born with a rare facial deformity called mandibulofacial dysostosis and endured 27 surgeries. His facial features cause him to stand out, and as a result he is harassed and bullied. He often wears a Star Wars helmet to hide his face.

In one scene, the principal of Auggie's school is talking to three of his classmates who have been making fun of Auggie. He challenges them by telling them, "he cannot change the way he looks – we need to change the way we see."

I was moved by the idea of changing the way we see. Faith in God calls us to a new way of seeing ourselves, each other and the created world around us. Faith isn't so much believing in mind-bending propositions or ideas that defy reason as it is seeing through the lens of love. It is seeing ourselves, our neighbors and the world that God has entrusted to us as God sees them, with unconditional love.



This month we make the journey to Jerusalem with Jesus. We walk beside Him as he enters Jerusalem to waving palms and shouts of "Hosanna, blessed is the One who comes in the name of the Lord (April 14)." We make our way to the upper room where Jesus asks to wash our feet and commands us to "do to others as I have done to you" and where Jesus gives us his very life in the gifts of bread and wine (April 18). We see Jesus convicted, mocked and beaten and watch as he is crucified (April 19). We make our way with the faithful women who come to the tomb and see that it is empty and proclaim: "He is risen indeed (April 20 & 21)."

As we make this journey of Holy Week, we witness the depth of God's love for all of God's children. We see love for those who abandoned Him. We witness love for those who carried out a horrible injustice. We see a love more powerful than death. We witness a love that can change the way we see ourselves, each other and the world around us, a love that leads to a more just, compassionate and understanding world.


