Capital Project Update



Dear Friends of St. Paul's, Many of you have asked or inquired about the status of our capital projects, now that we have completed our internal fundraising campaign.

The congregation raised 1.8 million dollars for repairs to our historic building. This was an enormous achievement. In addition, we took a thanksgiving offering to serve our

neighbors, raising \$25,000 to erase medical debt in our local area. **Undue estimates that we will erase 3.2 million dollars worth of medical debt in St. Louis, Cook, Lake, Douglas, Carlton and Itasca counties.**

We should be very proud of both of these things. *And*, we also knew when we started this project that our building needed 2.6 million dollars (or more) worth of repair.

As you can imagine, there is a gap between what we raised and what it will cost to do everything we set out to do. The Vestry, the capital team, and I have been discussing how to proceed based on congregational priorities and funding availability. I want to share with you, in brief, the different pieces of this puzzle so you can be fully informed of where we currently stand.

The elevator project was of the highest importance, and the project with the lowest cost, coming in at just under \$100,000. We signed a contract with our elevator servicer for this work to be completed as soon as possible. There is a lack of qualified technicians available, and our servicer is currently working on an emergency residential project, so we are working as best we can to get firm dates.

The boilers showed their age and their attitude this winter, and so it became necessary to move forward on the

boiler replacement and heating control modernization. This project came in higher than expected, at just under \$600,000. The Vestry voted in May to move forward on this project at the recommendation of the Property Committee. It is set to begin in June and conclude by September 1.

This leaves us with about 1.1 million to work with.

The cost of the organ restoration has increased, and the company we selected in the fall, Berghaus, believes that a satisfactory restoration will cost between 1.4 and 1.5 million. Prices on a project of this size vary before a contract is officially signed, and we are in the process of negotiating some things for a lower cost. This does mean, though, that committing to this project without additional funding, grants or otherwise, would incur significant risk.

The property committee is currently getting clear estimates on the parts of the building that require tuckpointing the most. This will help us assess the best way forward. The internal sanctuary repair is on the back burner for now.

This summer, the next phase of fundraising is underway. Nancy Schuldt is exploring and applying for grants from places like the Sisler Foundation (an organ restoration fund) and the Fund for Sacred Places. We are hoping to expand our knowledge of other foundations or philanthropists who may be interested in our projects. If you have ideas or suggestions, the Vestry and I are eager to hear them.

Though this isn't perfect news, consider how much work we have done together in the last year. At this time last year, raising a million dollars felt insurmountable, and by the grace of God, we have far exceeded that. We have also erased millions of dollars of medical debt, living out Jesus' way of generosity even when funds here are tight.

At St. Paul's, we embrace our Anglican history and we bake SCONES! It is a huge undertaking and we are tremendously grateful to Sue Brown and a large group of wonderful parishioners who volunteer to prepare these delicious scones and donate them to the Rhubarb Festival. If you want to buy some scones, you better arrive to the festival early, because they sell out early every year.

Here are some details from Sue Brown, for everyone willing to help make the scones:

The St. Paul's baking team has a goal of 700 rhubarb scones this year. I am hoping for some new volunteers along with familiar faces, to join with the prep, baking, packaging and delivery of scones. You don't have to be a baker, as there are lots of other jobs to do as well, maybe even some taste-testing on Friday! The schedule for the week prior to the festival is as follows:

- ♦ **June 14-21**—Bring clean, dry, whole stalks of rhubarb (leaves removed) in a grocery bag marked CHUM RHUBARB and put them in the refrigerator of the Parish Kitchen this week

- ♦ **Sunday, June 21**—Rhubarb chopping will take place in the kitchen following the 10 am church service
- ♦ **Tuesday, June 23**— a select group will pre-measure ingredients
- ♦ **Thursday, June 25**—Mixing and prepping scones from 8:30 am until done
- ♦ **Friday, June 26**—Baking, packaging and delivery of scones from 8:30 am until done

Laundry Love is Moving and Grooving!

As part of St. Paul's Outreach, every 2nd Tuesday volunteers from St. Paul's and our partner organizations provide funding and volunteers to help low-income residents do their laundry. This program is called Laundry Love.

Since March, Laundry Love is hosted on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays at the Maytag Laundromat at 820 E. 4th Street. Other weeks remain at Spirit Valley Laundromat for now (it is for sale). The new location is more convenient for some of our guests. In addition, the Maytag owner is great to work with and provides a 15% discount, allowing us to provide \$575 worth of laundry services for \$500. Although it took a while for customers to find us at the new location, every month gets busier. On May 12, ten volunteers helped 32 guests wash and dry almost 50 loads of laundry. We had volunteers associated with St. Paul's, the YMCA and our new

2nd Tuesday partner church: Grace Lutheran, which is located on Hwy 53 in Hermantown. Holy Cross Lutheran, located on Arlington Ave in Duluth, is partnering with us to provide volunteers.

After struggling financially last year, I am happy to report that we now have solid funding and a financial plan to keep Laundry Love going and reduce the need to turn people away. Funding sources include generous donations from several members of St. Paul's, a portion of the Outreach annual budget, contributions from other churches and Temple Israel, an Essentia Community Health grant and proceeds from our annual Laundry Love plant sale.

April 2026 financials were presented to the Finance Committee and Vestry at their May meetings. Below is a summary of the April General Operating Fund results.

Of note: We are already running a deficit fairly early in the year.

Both pledge and non-pledge income were less than budgeted for the month, but ahead of budget year-to-date. St. Paul's continues to be very diligent about expenses, keeping them under budget for April, as well as year to date.

The Statewide Pedestrian Bridge Planning Study project team is interested in speaking with community members that regularly use MnDOT pedestrian bridges to better understand how these bridges are used and how changes in design and/or location may impact their use. Outreach Update

For 2026, the Vestry allocated \$7,200 to the Outreach Committee (which is 2% of the pledge amount) to be given out as grants. In addition, the Committee held a bake sale in conjunction with the rummage which generated an additional \$1,565 and also expects to receive a portion of the rummage sale total. The Outreach Committee will also hold a plant sale on May 23 whose proceeds will benefit Laundry Love specifically .

Parishioners are invited to submit a grant request to be considered at our summer quarterly meeting in June. There's no deadline; applications come in on a rolling basis. So far, the Outreach Committee has approved a \$1,000 grant for the Damiano Soup Kitchen and a \$1,000 grant to Casa Maria food shelf at St. Nicholas Episcopal Church in Richfield, which distributes food to immigrant families sheltering in their homes from ICE raids. While Committee members themselves submit requests for such organizations as Damiano, Safe Haven, Life House, Laundry Love, Program for Aid to Victims of Sexual Assault, parishioners can also request funds for organizations that help those in need. 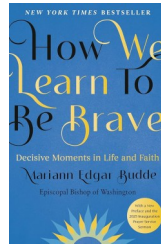


Graduation Sunday

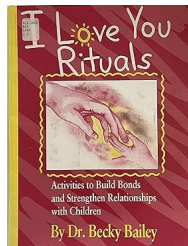

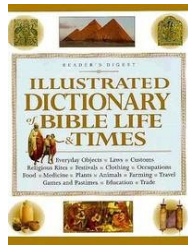

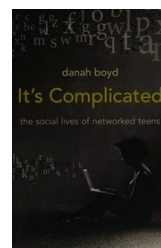
